INVITATION TO THE 5TH WORLD WATER FORUM

According to experts, nearly 40 percent of the world population is expected to live in water-stressed countries by the year 2015. What is more, the Forum will be used as an opportunity to explain to everybody the importance of water and to increase public awareness generally. The Turkish Republic Prime Minister's Water Prize will be awarded to journalists who contribute news items serving this purpose.

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM THE 5TH WORLD WATER FORUM

With the Istanbul Forum fast approaching, it is an exciting time for the world water community. Istanbul will be a place where the co-organizers of the Forum and the numerous contributors come together face to face for a week of debate, information, learning and experience exchanging, leading to strong decisions. Expectations are high for this Forum, and the positive impact that it can have on the wellbeing of mankind. A successful Forum would be one in which the expectations of these groups can be met, but also surpassed, and that is the challenge faced by the co-organizers.

The 5th World Water Forum's preparatory process has been designed with the aim of meeting these expectations. The Learning Centre, the Water Expo and Fair, the High-Level Panels, the Global Water Education Village, the Citizen's Water House, side events, poster presentations, social events, the International Water and Film Events, presentations of the water prizes, and a host of other activities throughout the week will aim to ensure that this Forum is a learning experience for all participants, providing new tools to deal with the water situation after the Forum.

In this way, under its theme "Bridging Divides for Water", the 5th World Water Forum will be much more than an event; it will represent a leap forward in efforts to show the link between water and development, energy, food security and climate change, amongst other questions.

It is expected that the results of the Forum will be linked with other ongoing initiatives, especially at the political level, such as the G8, UN-CSD and UNFCCC. The stated intention is that this Forum will make a difference to the way water is managed in the world.

Be part of these efforts to provide solutions to many of humanity's greatest priorities. Come to Istanbul to help in "Bridging Divides for Water". We look forward to the pleasure of welcoming you here.

FORUM COMPONENTS

A number of major components of the Forum will be held in parallel to the topic sessions, presentations of the regional process and political processes. Underlining the multi-stakeholder nature of the Forum, these components will be open to those interested in making a difference, sharing their ideas and enhancing their own knowledge base.

Learning Centre

The 5th World Water Forum's Learning Centre will offer participants an opportunity to gain practical skills and new capabilities to deal with water challenges in their home countries. These "how to" practical courses will be located in classrooms at the Feshane site of the venue and scheduled in parallel with the official programme on topics relevant to the six themes of the 5th World Water Forum.

Side Events

To have a further say on issues discussed during the Forum week, side events open up a unique platform for participants to present their latest projects, activities and to discuss issues that are not fully covered during the sessions. While this convivial atmosphere allows Forum participants to engage in networking activities through cocktail parties and receptions, side events will also allow the Forum issues to broaden and deepen.

Side events, which can be organized either in parallel to official sessions, during the lunch breaks or in the evenings, can take place either in the pavilions in the Water Fair or in specific rooms with a capacity of 50-150 people. Side events can be open to everyone as well as closed by a guest list. Side events held in parallel to Forum sessions are free of charge for two hours and a fee of 50 € will be charged for every exceeding hour. A fee of 150 € per hour will be charged for side events held during the lunch breaks and in the evenings. To apply to organise a side event please fill in the application form on the side events link of the Forum website, and send it back to sideevents@worldwaterforum5.org no later than 31 January, 2009.

Poster Exhibition

Posters related to both arts and science will be put on display in the Forum venue. They will be allocated in accordance with their content, whether it is a cultural one or whether it concerns the thematic side of the Forum. Thematic posters, which will complement to sessions, provide a visual form of contribution to the Forum.

Posters, which enable a form of communication among the participants, allow them to share their activities in a clear visual form. They are expected to broaden the debate on the topics. The poster exhibition will enable the Forum to gain both a vibrant atmosphere and more variety in topics covered. The Children's Forum gives the children representatives the opportunity to engage in meaningful dialogue with various stakeholders in dealing with global water issues. Additionally, children from different regions of the world will present their projects for local water problems, which in turn will culminate into global solutions.

Global Water Education Village

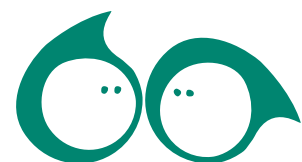
The 5th World Water Forum will include the 2nd Global Water Education Village, highlighting water education programs from around the world, displaying a variety of successful local action projects. The Village will also serve as an intergenerational connection point, encouraging interaction between students and global water leaders and will host events of the 3rd Children's World Water Forum. Other activities related to the Global Water Education Village include the Project WET Water School where students will engage in hands-on lessons teaching about the importance of water in their lives.

Green Forum Initiative

The 5th World Water Forum is the first of the World Water Fora where environmental impacts are being directly addressed in its organization. The Secretariat and Forum organizers are committed to the efficient use of water and energy, the minimization of waste, and the use of green products. The organizers with the Ministry of Environment and Forestry are taking a step to offset the CO₂ emissions of the Forum by planting one tree for every Forum participant. Working with local organizations, the GFI will raise awareness on water and carbon footprints among other activities, which should help to reduce the Forum's impact on the local area.

Istanbul Water Consensus

The Istanbul Water Consensus invites mayors and local government leaders to make a united commitment for water resource management in the face of global changes. The first part of the Consensus is a declaration and the second part is a specific commitment designed to be tailored according to the circumstances of the individual city or local authority.

THEMATIC DEVELOPMENT

What will water management look like in 2020 and beyond? How can the Millennium Development Goals be achieved? How are water, energy and food production interrelated and how can they be optimised? How can political decision-makers be encouraged to create policies that anticipate water-related disasters, rather than concentrating on relief efforts? How can stakeholder involvement lead to better management? How will the current financial crisis affect the water sector? How can today's youth be motivated to become tomorrow's water leaders?

These are just a few of the key questions of our time that will be debated and discussed during the approximately 100 sessions profiled at the 5th World Water Forum. These issues have been identified, explored and outlined over the past two years with the involvement of hundreds of organizations and over 700 contributions received from individuals through the 5th World Water Forum website and its Virtual Meeting Space.

The Thematic Programme has been designed in such a way as to examine various aspects of 23 different topics, each of which offer 3 to 5 related sessions. Through this approach, concrete solutions to these major questions will be proposed, issuing from the collaborative work on each topic. The overall objective is to then implement these solutions in order to move forward towards a better future for the world's water resources and the populations that need them.

At this point in the development process, session conveners have been assigned to coordinate each session. To ensure that all sessions are balanced in terms of participation, conveners have been asked to identify missing stakeholders that should be represented within their sessions and efforts will be made to reach out to those parties and include their points of view.

In addition, the Virtual Meeting Space (VMS) can be utilized by each topic working group to develop and further clarify their ideas and proposed solutions. Working spaces are already established for each topic, and you are free to react to the work that has been carried out thus far for consideration by the group as a whole. For example, discussion groups are made available precisely for this purpose.

Initial session descriptions can currently be viewed on the 5th World Water Forum website and in the VMS. The detail of each session will continue to evolve through the end of the year and will be published subsequently on the website, VMS and in the 5th Forum's Final Programme.

During the Forum itself, a number of products, such as "session situation documents", and topic and theme reports will summarize in a concise way the state of reflection on each key question and issue, including major recommendations. First framing the debate in writing will enable participants to spend a maximum amount of time during each session exchanging and discussing, rather than describing the state of affairs. In this way, everyone's voice may be heard.

So, come join us in Istanbul to help provide answers to those questions that need to be answered in order to ensure access to water and sanitation for all.

REGIONAL PROCESS

At the Forum itself, regions will have the opportunity to present their findings in a Regional Document, demonstrating their role in bridging divides and their orientations for future progress. Besides the regional plenary sessions, regional contributions will be embedded into the thematic sessions throughout the week. Likewise, regional coordinators have been an integral part of developing the Ministerial Agenda and hence a part of the political process.

The Americas Regional Consortium and its supervising Executive Committee under the coordination of the National Association of Water and Sanitation Utilities of Mexico (ANEAS) are leading the activities in the Americas in close collaboration with all participants the region. Each sub-region, Central, South and North America and the Caribbean, has developed a sub-regional document, which is integrated into the final Americas Regional Document that was presented in November 2008 at the Water Forum of the Americas in Iguassu Falls, Brazil (Region-Americas@worldwaterforum5.org).

The Asia-Pacific Water Forum has led the overall coordination of activities for the Asia-Pacific region. This region has chosen to prioritise the mobilisation of political commitment in this part of the world, as demonstrated by the organization of the 1st Asia-Pacific Water Summit held in Beppu, Japan in December 2007. The five sub-regions, namely Northeast Asia, Southeast Asia, South Asia, Central Asia and Oceania and the Pacific, are coordinated by an organization that works jointly with the Asia-Pacific Water Forum (Region-Asia-Pacific@worldwaterforum5.org).

The European Water Partnership (EWP), as the Regional Coordinator for Europe, has focused on building connections among countries, organizations and initiatives with an emphasis on the involvement of Eastern Europe. At the World Water Fair, a European Water Area will gather European participants and offer them the possibility to organize their own meetings and activities. The EWP is also striving to connect European politicians to the Forum, principally through the organization of a high-level summit within the European Parliament, held in November 2008. EWP also plans to present a "European Water Vision". (For further information please write to Region-Europe@worldwaterforum5.org)

The African Development Bank, on behalf of the African Ministers' Council on Water, has been working to mobilise stakeholders in Africa in order to catalyze specific African contributions to the Forum. The regional process was launched in August 2008 by the African Development Bank, followed up in October 2008 at a meeting in Addis Ababa (Region-Africa@worldwaterforum5.org).

As one of the special country groups, the region of MENA/Arab countries, under the coordination of the Arab Water Council is diligently completing its analysis. The Arab Water Forum, held in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia in November 2008, was the culmination of the MENA/Arab Countries regional process (Region-Mena-ArabCountries@worldwaterforum5.org). The Mediterranean regional preparatory process was developed under the coordination of the Mediterranean Water Institute over the past years (Region-Mediterranean@worldwaterforum5.org). Likewise, The General Directorate of State Hydraulic Works of Turkey (DSI), which will be host to the 5th World Water Forum, has been organizing meetings as coordinator for the region In and Around Turkey (Region-Turkey@worldwaterforum5.org).

POLITICAL COMPONENT OF THE FORUM

Addressing the combined effects of changes in the global environment, demand on natural resources and economy is arguably the most important challenge of our time, as evidenced by the amount of press and recent high-level international meetings related to these issues. How climate change, population growth, mass migration to cities, and the current financial crisis and many other challenges relate to the ability of the world's nations to provide their citizens with water and water related services adds a baffling dimension of difficulty to coming up with solutions.

The Political Process of the World Water Forum exists because, simply put, water is a political matter. Politicians at every level need to know every angle of the water issue in order for them to create an enabling environment and the right policies to meet the challenges. This policy mix is increasingly more difficult to determine given the enormous environmental, economic, and social changes that are now prevalent.

Heads of State

Also associated in the 5th World Water Forum Political Process is a meeting with the participation of a limited number of Heads of State. The outcome of this meeting will be a high-level appeal for action to governments around the world citing the importance of water and the role it plays in development and society. The Heads of State Meeting will take place in 16 March 2009.

Ministers

The Ministerial Conference, and the multi-stakeholder process that leads to it, aims to prepare a Ministerial Statement and a Ministerial Agenda attached to it listing priority issues for priority action on water management issues. This process has also built in increased interaction with water stakeholders, including those involved in the regional, thematic and major group processes. As an example, these stakeholders, international organizations and key institutions are given the opportunity to make alternative or complementary suggestions to the Ministerial Process discussion documents. The Ministerial Conference of the 5th World Water Forum will take place between 20-22 March, 2009, and we expect a participation of around two hundred Ministers from all over the world who will adopt the Ministerial Agenda with a clear message on the importance of the matter. At the first of four PrepComs, the gathering officially launched the preparation of the Ministerial Agenda, on the overall theme "Water Management Adaptation Strategies for Global Changes, including Climate Change/Variability". This theme offers the possibility of taking two approaches: How water management has to adapt to changes, but also how water can be used as a tool for this adaptation. The process has evolved in Geneva and will be continued in Rome and Istanbul to prepare and agree on the Ministerial Statement and Agenda, which are envisaged to be concluded during the Senior Officials Meeting that will take place in 18 March 2009.

Parliamentarians

The Parliamentarians' portion of the 5th Forum will be a dynamic interaction among members of national assemblies from around the world including discussions on the definition of minimal national legislation for water and sanitation, and sensitive issues to discuss, such as right to access to water and sanitation, transboundary waters, global changes and decentralization policies. The Parliamentarians Days on 18-19 March 2009 will have a major focus on roundtable discussions on these issues as well as conduct a workshop to further develop the "Water Legislation Helpdesk" proposal.

Istanbul Water Consensus

Cities and agglomerations are under increasing pressure to deliver water and sanitation services to citizens. Global changes have led Mayors and local leaders around the world to become increasingly concerned about and committed to ensuring water and sanitation services. Following an inclusive process, in which assistance has been provided by the organizers of the 5th World Water Forum and its partners, the Istanbul Water Consensus (IWC) - an agreement among local authorities across the globe - will bring urban and rural water challenges to the local, national and global agenda to improve actions. Two days will be dedicated to Local authorities during the 5th World Water Forum on 18-19 March 2009.

The three-level interaction on 20 March will be a way for Parliamentarians and the local authorities to interact with Ministers in sharing what they have achieved in working towards the 5th World Water Forum, as well as listen to what their counterparts have developed.

MAJOR GROUPS AS A MAJOR COMPONENT: A COMPREHENSIVE VISION OF PARTICIPATION

A Forum that really 'bridges divides for water' and could claim to have equitable participatory mechanisms which aim to reach out to as many actors as possible, needs to have a comprehensive vision of participation. The 5th World Water Forum's participation vision entails diversity, inclusiveness and quality as its main components.

With the inclusion of the Major Groups Framework from Agenda 21 the Forum co-organizers have acknowledged the need to ensure multi-stakeholder dialogues are conducted at every step of the preparatory process and during the event itself. Yet for the sake of a balanced participation, it is crucial to ensure that not only the well-resourced and powerful members of that group are included but also disadvantaged ones.

Acknowledging the diversity among different major groups also implies that different participation mechanisms would be required for different groups. Thus, various strategies are being developed to make the 5th World Water Forum open for participation.

Means of participation

The major groups are invited to share their ideas and identify their priorities amongst the sessions through discussion fora in the Virtual Meeting Space (VMS) (<http://portal.worldwaterforum5.org>). Further possibilities are being studied to ensure that major groups are recognized at sessions during the Forum. (Contact: thematicprocess@worldwaterforum5.org).

Two seats are reserved for each major group in the Ministerial Process PrepCom meetings to be organized in Rome and Istanbul, as was the case in Paris and Geneva. Moreover, the 5th World Water Forum will allow major groups to lobby for action to be taken at the political level. (Contact: politicalprocess@worldwaterforum5.org).

Major Groups also have the possibility of organizing side events at the Forum to discuss further their perspective and priority action on water-related issues. (Contact: sideevents@worldwaterforum5.org).

The major groups will all have their own private networking spaces in the Forum venue, for them to coordinate their activities throughout the week. (Contact: fair@worldwaterforum5.org).

Major groups may support the green activities by adopting and promoting the Green Forum Initiative's principles, or by providing fresh ideas. (Contact: gfi@worldwaterforum5.org).

In parallel to the World Water Forum, the Children's and Youth Water Fora will take place with the active participation of children and young people from around the world. (Contact: childrenforum@worldwaterforum5.org and youthforum@worldwaterforum5.org).

WATER PRIZES

King Hassan II Great World Water Prize

The King Hassan II Great World Water Prize is awarded to an institution, organisation, individual or group of individuals in view of their outstanding scientific, economic, technical, environmental, social, institutional, cultural or political achievements in the field of water resources. The contribution of the applicant should always reflect cooperation and development.

The prize will be awarded during the opening ceremony and the value of the prize is \$100,000.

The Kyoto Grand World Water Prize

The Kyoto Grand World Water Prize aims to honour a distinguished individual or organisation whose grassroots activities work towards addressing the critical water needs of communities and regions. The prize money must be used by the winning organisation to continue the award-winning exercise or initiate similar ones.

The prize will be awarded during the closing ceremony and the value of the prize is JPY 3,000,000.

Turkish Republic Prime Minister's Water Prize

Turkey, as the host country of the 5th World Water Forum, aims to honour individuals who have contributed to society's increased awareness of water-related issues, through the endowment of a prize. The importance of the media in fostering a paradigm shift in public opinion cannot be underestimated. Within this context, the Turkish Republic Prime Minister's Water Prize will be an award to journalists.

The Prize will be offered to one local and one foreign journalist for their excellent published works on water-related issues, in the Turkish and non-Turkish press. Each winning journalist will receive a prize of €20,000. Please send your application through the VMS by no later than 15 February 2009.

"Compromiso Mexico" Water Prize

This Award acknowledges the genuine concern voiced by national and international citizens and governments, regarding the increasing global water crisis as well as current practices in water supply, sewerage and sanitation services; which demand the collective attention and joint endeavour of the nations of the world.

The Alliance's immediate pursuit is to propose institutional measures based on truly notable water utility practices which, having followed innovative local public policies for fresh water supply and wastewater management and treatment, have rendered clear and identifiable social benefits.

First place will be granted an award of \$ 15,000, while second place will be awarded \$ 10,000 and the third \$ 5,000.

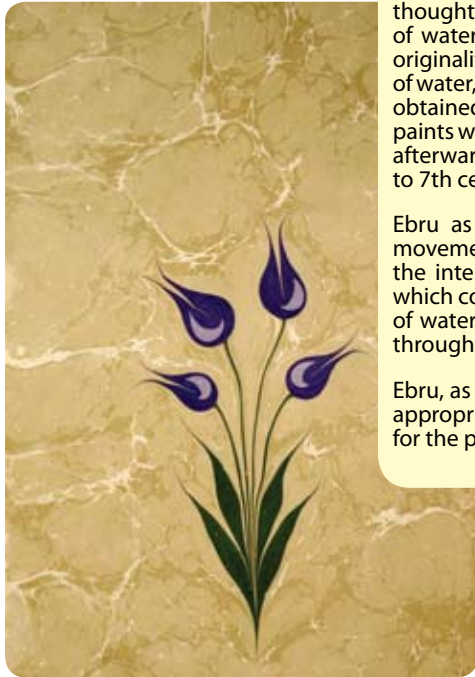

The Art of Ebru:

"Ebru" is described as an art, where the feelings and thoughts of the artist come to be embodied on the surface of water. Each practice, never possible to reoccur, has its originality and secrecy within the unpredictable movements of water, which gives the pattern its last shape. The pattern is obtained through dripping and sprinkling handmade natural paints with brushes onto the surface of thickened water and afterwards transferred to paper. The art of Ebru dates back to 7th century, approximately.

Ebru as a word is a metaphor evoking the notions of movement, flexibility, permeability, variability and suggests the interaction and integration of diverse cultures. Ebru, which comes into being through the colourful aggregation of water and paper, is the symbol of the course of history through engagement and permanence.

Ebru, as a metaphor describing Turkish culture in the most appropriate way, has been used as the ultimate inspiration for the program of arts and culture.



Water Exhibition

It is created by American Museum of Natural History in 2006 – 2007 and will be displayed in ITU Maslak Campus Natural History Museum between 4 March 2009 – 14 June 2009. Exhibition with its live animals, hands-on exhibits and immersive dioramas invite the whole family to explore the beauty and wonder of water and reveal the challenges to protecting Earth's most precious life-giving resource.

Reduced Registration Fees for Broader Participation

Further Support for Participation: PAID

In addition, a participant aid programme (known as PAID) has been set up to fund the participation of a number of individuals in the 5th World Water Forum. The application form has been available from the 5th World Water Forum website. Selection preference is given to applicants who have been actively involved during the 5th World Water Forum's preparatory process, who show great motivation and provide concrete justification for participation as well as those who commit to work beyond the Forum via evaluation reports, conveying the Forum's messages in their regions and institutions afterwards. Gender balance of the applicants is considered while distributing funds. Applicants selected for funding will have their registration fees, lodging in Istanbul, internal travel and meals covered for the duration of their stay in Istanbul.

Visa Facilities for Participants

The procedure to obtain a visa in order to attend the Forum has also been simplified. All visas for Forum participants will be free of charge. After registering, you will receive an invitation letter by e-mail, which can be used to obtain your visa. Participants will be separated into three categories as regards their visas, and the list of countries in each category will soon be found on the Forum website under Logistics.

- Nationals of countries where Turkey has an embassy or a consulate should apply for their visa in these representations, with their invitation letter confirming their registration and payment. These visas must be obtained before leaving for Turkey.
- Nationals of countries where Turkey does not have a diplomatic mission will be able to receive their visas at the airport upon their arrival. After registering, their names will be delivered to Istanbul International Atatürk Airport, where a special Forum desk will be set up to meet the participants and deliver their visas.
- Nationals of countries that normally need to pick up their visa at the border will still need to follow that procedure.

If Forum participants are planning to register onsite, the visa arrangements are under the responsibility of them

Prepare the Debate Through the Virtual Meeting Space

When registering, you will be asked to create a user account, which will allow you to go back to the registration site at a later date to make any changes, as well as providing you access to the 5th World Water Forum's Virtual Meeting Space (VMS), available on <http://portal.worldwaterforum5.org>.

The VMS is a collaborative space for all those interested in taking part in the debate prior to the Forum, finding out more about the latest developments, and planning their participation in the Forum. It will also be used to disseminate information during the week of the Forum, to those within and outside the Forum venue.

Media Accreditation

Press accreditation will be provided by the Office of the Prime Minister Directorate General of Press and Information. On the website, www.byegm.gov.tr, the registration form will be available from February 2nd to March, 2nd for foreign press.

Arrivals to Istanbul:

As the official airline of the 5th World Water Forum, Turkish Airlines is providing a 20% discount on flight prices for Forum participants, to travel to Istanbul in March. This discount is effective for tickets purchased from Turkish Airlines offices all around the world. FORUM VENUE ON WATERWAY, THE GOLDEN HORN

The subject of water will be discussed for the first time in a place so close to water at the 5th World Water Forum. The 5th World Water Forum will be the first time that the Congress and Cultural Centre at Sütlüce, and the Feshane facility in the Golden Horn will be used for such a purpose. There will be regular ferry boat services to provide access to these two venues from the city centre, as well as from the opposite side of the Golden Horn. The Golden Horn in this sense provides a waterway venue for the Forum, while it bridges the two conference centres on each side.

The Sütlüce Congress Centre

The former Sütlüce Slaughterhouse has been transformed into a Congress Centre containing a concert and congress hall, cinemas, exhibition and meetings facilities, a theatre and multi-storey car park. The Sütlüce Congress Centre will host thematic process and regional and political process sessions during the Forum and will also fulfil the role of press centre.

Feshane

Feshane, the fez (a popular type of hat in Ottoman Empire) factory of Ottoman times, will be the main registration centre. There will be regular ferry boat services from the city centre taking passengers to the waterfront in front of the building, where Forum registrations will be realised. At the same time Feshane will host a Fair, Exhibition, Learning Centre, Global Education Village, Major Groups and also Thematic Process sessions of the Forum.

Accommodation

"The list of hotels and the map showing their locations will be indicated on the webpage. Furthermore and beginning third week of January a section will be dedicated in the online registration process for hotel reservation."

Transportation in Istanbul

Buses will be operating between congress centres and hotels, as well as between the airport and the hotels, on a regular basis and throughout the week. Mornings, 07:00-10:00, evenings, 17:00-20:00, every 30 minutes, and from 10:00 to 17:00 every one hour, busses will be providing the transportation, as the ferry boats will be within the same timing schedule. Ferry boat transportation will enable passengers to travel from/to Kadıköy, Yenikapı, Kabataş to/from the two ports of the venue, Sütlüce and Feshane, while at the same time continuous ferry boat service between Sütlüce and Feshane will be available as well.

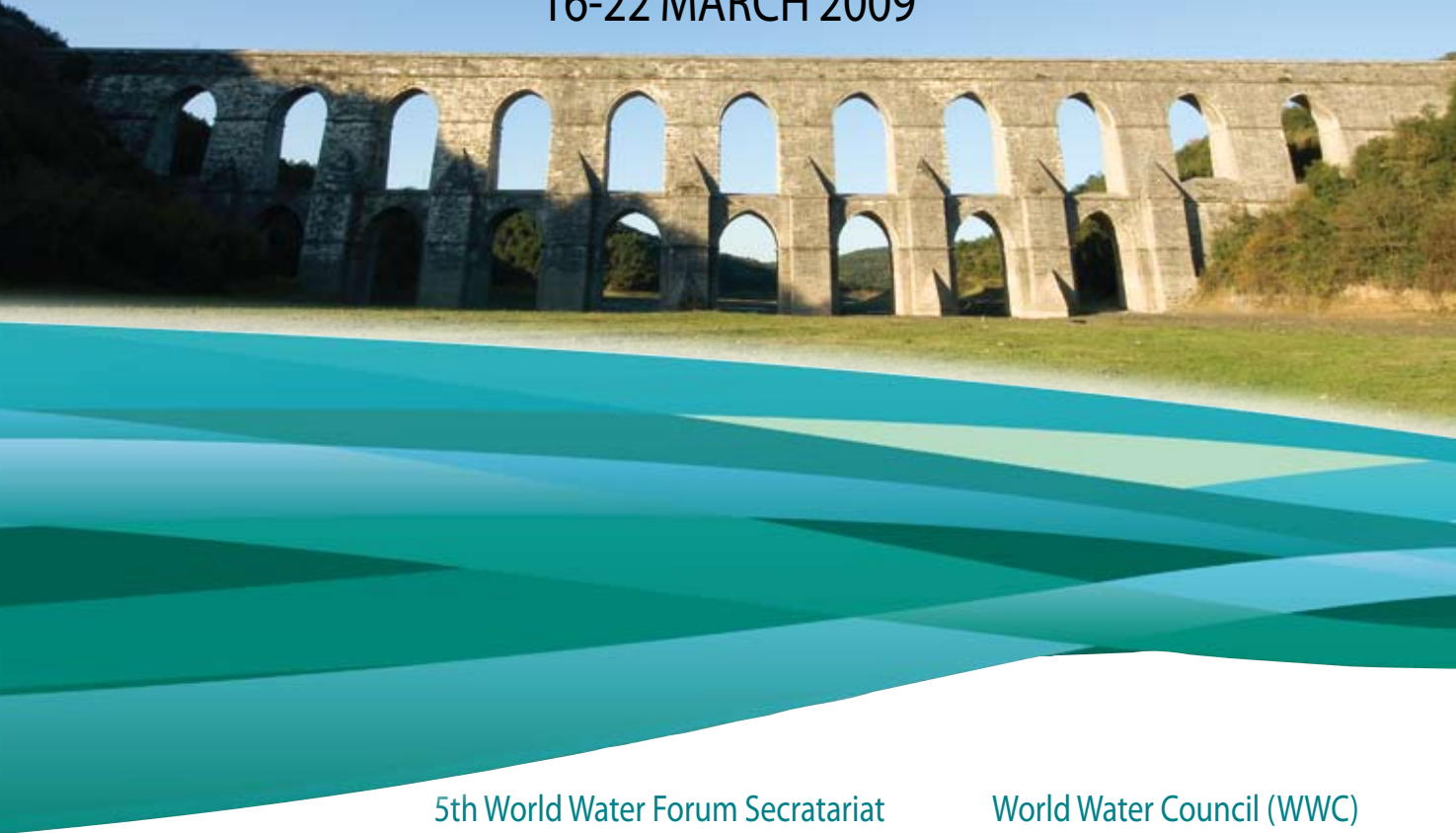
