Volume Special: Annual RIHN Project Presentation Meeting



Before PEC meeting of February, RIHN community gets together towards the end of the year to present each RIHN project's annual research performance and findings. We usually spent three days as all RIHN researchers and other colleagues, who are usually previous RIHN researchers or board members and invited as commentators, presenting each project and have open discussion on any matter related with the ongoing progress and future

plan of the projects. There are two main purposes of this annual gathering: help the projects that will present at the PEC meeting in the following February to get prepared and promote dynamic and stimulating discussions for better research progress and organization of projects as well as encourage young researchers to actively join RIHN endeavor of promoting integrated environmental studies.

Research at RIHN

Vulnerability and Resilience of Social-Ecological Systems (Leader: Assoc. Prof. Chieko Umetsu, FY2007-FY2011)

This project aimed at "tackling challenging issues of poverty, human security and environmental degradations in a semi-arid area's rain fed agricultural economy that is highly vulnerable to climate and other environmental variability" (project website). The project has developed a method based on assessment of resilience according to four research themes.

The first theme focus was the soil and forest resources to analyze ecological resilience. The second theme was based on conducting interviews with farm households/communities and identifying the factors affecting social resilience. The third theme looked at the historical changes in land tenure system made by government policies and their effects on the natural environment. This theme also covered the socio-political factors of increasing vulnerability and the process of collapse and recovery of resilience in different communities. The last theme selected was a group of issues like utilizing statistics, remote sensing data and aerial photographs to help trace long-term changes in soil and forestry resources in addition to the analysis of data on rainfall and temperature.

The project has extensively published and communicated its research findings via public and research seminars held both in Japan and in fields where the project was implemented with local partners. http://www.chikyu.ac.jp/resilience/
