Project Research will work closely with stakeholder groups at sites in Japan, the Philippines, Indonesia, US and Canada to conduct questionnaire surveys and organize/coordinate a series of participatory workshops for selected stakeholders on the WEFN.

(1) Ability to conduct original research in collaboration with other project members (2) Ability to work closely with the project leader and other project members to manage this project (3) Higher level of English language skills required
