Recommendations

- 1 Infrastructure in Asian countries where birth rate is being lowered should be designed to meet currently growing demand in outlook as well as currently unseen future aged society at the same time.
- 2 To diagnose social, economic or biological aspects of patience in urbanization and prescribe for them we need various approaches of natural science, engineering, social science and humanities and integrated perspectives for solutions by adequately linking diagnosis and prescription.
- 3 Pathway of Asian cities should be carefully chosen as to secure high income and wellbeing by facilitating public transport systems to attract people living nearby to allow high levels of walking and cycling, with low levels of car use.

- 4 Urban sustainability should be secured for different groups of citizens to meet social vulnerability and social justice.
- 5 Human beings should stand in awe of nature and live with nature, by properly applying the knowledge of science and technology and by empowering themselves.
- Occurrence of disasters cannot be stopped. The important is that the habitation areas are prepared by designing them as to accept these disasters, considering the vulnerability of the society.
