


Notes of cover page photos

- I. Desert in Hsinchiang, Uighur Autonomous Region: the white ground is covered with salt. This area is thought to have been covered with abundant green vegetation three thousand years before. It has turned into unproductive land due to the overuse of ground water for agricultural development.
