The Program Director will be responsible for managing and coordinating research activities of one of the three Research Programs.

During the Phase III planning period (2016-2021), the Research Institute for Humanity and Nature (RIHN) will bring together the existing stand-alone projects in a structure consisting of the three Research Programs below, and aim to develop novel global environmental research contributing to the solution of global environmental problems in such a way that is only possible through the integration of multiple research projects.

The Program Director's duty is to manage research activities of one of these three Research Programs.

Specifically,

- A) To manage the Research Program, including organizing calls for research proposals relevant to the program and provide guidance to the projects;
- B) To be subject to annual external evaluation of the Research Program including its action plan, research results, and management;
